

# What wedges are best suited for your game?

Last week we spoke about loft and carry and how, with all the rain we've been having, you have to carry your ball further because the ball does not run as much off the tee. Well, the next step is to look at those shots that have come up short or just missed the green.

Most people consider this shot you will be faced with as really tough shots. The question is, are they really that tough? And are you

ie right weage?

When you decide what wedge you are going to use, there are a few things to look at - degree, loft and grooves. Let's say you have missed the green and you need to carry the ball over a greenside bunker. You will have to ensure that your wedge has got enough loft to get the ball up in the air and carry it over the bunker. When you find yourself in the rough or in a bunker, the bounce on your wedge is very important. If you have a very steep swing you'll need more bounce to make sure the wedge will get the ball up quicker and carry further. If your swing is a bit more shallow you'll need less bounce, this will ensure that the club gets in underneath the ball and prevents you from hitting the ball thin and over the green. Lastly, you'll be looking at the grooves on your wedge. This is important to get enough spin and make the ball stop quicker on the green. If you struggle to get enough spin, your grooves might be worn out and it is time for a new wedge.

Selecting the right wedge is a great factor for game improvement, so swing by the golfshop and let us help you find the perfect wedges for you.

#### Iron toe down

Strike the ball with the toe slightly down and your ball will go right of the target (right-handers).


