

From the Club

We tested two of the new par three tees over the weekend of Club Champs and all the people I spoke to were impressed.

The new tee on the 6th hole shortens the hole to about 135m, but the bunkering looks like they were designed for the new tee. One to the left, one to the right and one over the green. We will be planting a few trees over the green to hide the Ambrose Lofts. The average score for the two rounds on this hole was 3.8, which makes it a little easier than the other Par 3's, which is because it doesn't have any water.





The new 12th hole was described by one player as "Mickey Mouse". It's very short, but let's remember that many of the most talked about Par 3's in golf are very short - the Postage Stamp at Royal Troon; the 12th at Augusta, and the 6th at Pebble Beach are all fabulous holes.

In the final three-ball in Club Champs, all three players missed the green with a less than 100m shot.

The hole is tricky and requires perfect distance control. Short is a dip of about a metre, and over the back is a bunker. You will feel really silly if you drop 1 or more shots on this hole.

We will play these two holes off temporary tees until we do the coursework changes towards the end of winter.

The course will be re-rated once all the changes have been made.

The New Range is opening soon

Using two holes off the old nine and the old driving range, the new range be much longer and can accommodate many more people. Our two PGA Professionals will be on-hand to offer you quality coaching. We will also have a limited 100 Range Memberships for sale.

New tees will be built at the same time as the course changes during winter.

Golf etiqutte

We found this article recently about golf etiquette, which has some valid points that we can all be reminded of. Here's part 1 of 2: -

- 1. RESPECT: The most important of the etiquette rules relates to respect for other golfers. You need to keep your voice down better yet, shut up completely during someone's swing. Don't even fidget or rattle your clubs when someone is about to play a shot, while a ringing cell phone on the course is a big no-no.
- 2. WHERE TO STAND: The general rule is never to stand in front of another player who is playing a shot. That should be easy enough to remember after the first time you catch a misdirected golf ball between the eyes. The best place to stand is perpendicular to the person and facing him.
- 3. ORDER: The person furthest from the hole plays first. Of course, if you are under time pressure, then players in your group may agree to play 'ready golf', which means that you play when you are ready, as long as no one else is playing at the same time.
- 4. SPEED UP: Even if you aren't holding up the group behind you, your job is to keep up with the group playing ahead of you. If the gap extends to a full hole, you are playing too slowly and are likely to hold up the field. If you are playing slowly and looking for golf balls often, consider letting the group behind you play through while you continue your search.


